Eco-resorts

Six Senses Laamu was the first resort to sign up to the Fish for Tomorrow (Laamaseelu Masveriyaa) programme founded by Maldives Resilient Reefs.

This programme ensures that all fish served at the resort is caught sustainably and that all local fishers receive a fair price for their catch.

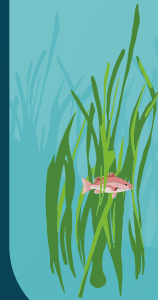
Since then, more resorts from across the Maldives have joined the programme.



Conscious construction

Seagrass meadows are often damaged or removed during resort construction and operations.

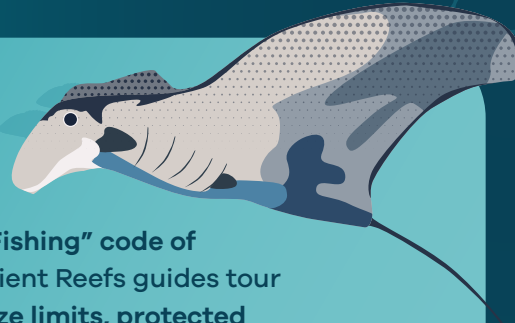
In 2025, Maldives Resilient Reefs and Blue Marine Foundation launched the #SeagrassIndustryLeaders project. Resorts from across the Maldives have pledged their support to protect a minimum of 80 per cent of their seagrass meadows and adopt more sustainable practices like raking instead of removal, positioning themselves at the forefront of sustainable tourism.



Codes of conduct

The "Guest Recreational Fishing" code of conduct by Maldives Resilient Reefs guides tour operators on gear type, size limits, protected species and no take areas.

The code also encourages tour operators to be ocean stewards and to always treat fish with care and respect.



Education and awareness

Some resorts, tour operators and dive centres deliver marine conservation presentations to their guests.

This helps to build knowledge, both in locals and tourists, about how to enjoy the Maldives in a responsible way.
