



IN THE SEAGRASS

The humpback red snapper (Lutjanus gibbus) is in its juvenile stage.
The protection provided by the seagrass meadow allows them to feed and grow, while hiding from their predators.

Humpback red snappers mature at 2.5 years at about 21.5cm in length.

INTERCONNECTED snappe grow in mangro

IN THE MANGROVES

Juvenile humpback red snappers find refuge and grow in the shelter of the mangrove roots.

Humpback red snappers can grow up to 50cm long and live for up to 18 years!

ON THE CORAL REEF

The humpback red snapper is in its adult stage, sometimes forming large schools. This is where they go to produce the next generation.
